COLLEGE UNIFORM POLICY

Ratified 28 May 2020

In making Catholic College Sale the School of their choice, parents and students are fully aware that this entails wearing the designated College uniform and adhering to the accompanying requirements of personal presentation. Students, parents and staff should be clear about the expectations regarding the uniform and its wearing.

1. The uniform

- Is a symbol of the College and a public declaration of its values, standards and beliefs, such as inclusivity of all students.
- Can create a sense of collective and individual pride in students and their identification with the School.
- Has the potential to encourage group security
- Can enhance the safety of individual students and groups of students by stipulating particular items for particular activities.
- Is a civic behaviour that is evident in many aspects of society.
- Supports students in the requirement of adhering to a dress code.
- Can prevent turning classrooms and school yard into daily fashion competitions.
- Reflects discipline and order within the school environment.
- Helps staff to identify unwelcome visitors to the School.
- Assists staff to recognise students when off campus.

2. Uniform Stockists

The regulation College uniform is stocked by:

- David's Menswear, Raymond Street, Sale.

Blazer and hats are purchased directly through the College Uniform Shop or on CDFPay. A designated date in January, advised via the website and SMS will be made for direct sales.

The VET on Campus Uniform is stocked by:

- SWF Group, 332 Raglan Street Sale.

3. College Uniform Shop

Catholic College Sale operate a uniform shop at 22 Pearson Street, Sale:

- Tuesdays 3.30pm – 4.30pm
- Thursdays 9.00am – 10.00am

Uniforms suitable for all Year level.

Items must be paid for at the time of purchase and cannot be charged to School accounts.

Second hand uniform is not sold on consignment but purchased by the College.

Only items in good order will be accepted for sale.

Blazers left for sale must be dry cleaned.

4. Expectations on the wearing of the uniform

The good standing of the College is significantly influenced by the way students wear the uniform and present themselves.

Students are expected to present themselves well and to wear the uniform, including footwear, correctly (eg shirts tucked in etc). This applies during School hours, while travelling to and from School and when students engage in School activities out of School hours. As well, students are to give attention to cleanliness, grooming and neatness.

The Uniform code takes precedence over a student's individual preference in matters of uniform. Student apparel consists only of the approved College uniform. All items should be clearly labelled to assist in the return of lost or misplaced items.

Parents/Carers will give full support to the College authorities in ensuring that the uniform requirements and personal presentation of the students are in full accord with the College's uniform regulations. Parents/Carers will provide the student with an explanatory note should a student be temporarily unable to comply fully with the uniform regulations ie: full school uniform or full sports uniform.

Monitoring the correct wearing of the uniform is the joint responsibility of the student, his/her parent(s) or guardians and members of staff. Any incorrect item of clothing is deemed to be out of uniform. The Pastoral teacher is responsible for checking uniform at the start of the day and noting offences. Teachers are expected to monitor uniform in all classes and to ensure that students enter and leave classes appropriately dressed (ie. Shirts tucked in and no incorrect items with the uniform).

On excursions, unless otherwise stated, full College Uniform is required.

5. Accessories and Personal Presentation

- a. Hair – Hair must be neat and clean. Some subtle natural colouring is permitted. Extreme and/or un-natural colouring and hairstyles are not permitted. What constitutes an extreme or unnatural hairstyle will be determined by the Campus Directors. Hair is to be tied back if shoulder length or longer using a plain navy or white ribbon or elasticised hair tie. Students must be clean shaven and hair must be cut no shorter than a "number 2".
- b. Jewellery – A plain set of silver or gold sleepers or studs may be worn in the lobes of the ear. Sleepers are to be no longer than 1cm in diameter and studs no larger than 3mm. Bracelets, chains and rings may not be worn. (The only exception is a fine neck chain with a small cross). Obvious use of cosmetics (including nail polish) is not permitted. Piercings, other than those in the ear mentioned above, are not to be visible. Tattoos are not permitted.
- c. Hats – During Terms 1 and 4, the regulation College hat is a compulsory part of a SunSmart school.
- d. Scarves/Gloves – Only plain navy scarves and gloves are permitted to be worn.
- e. Undergarments - Any garments worn underneath the College uniform are not to be visible.
- f. Dress Length – The girl's Summer length should be no higher than approximately 2cm above the knee.
- g. Blazers - Blazers are compulsory for all years during Terms 2 and 3, and optional during Terms 1 and 4. They are to be worn to and from school and to be the outer garment for warmth when one is required. Blazers are to be worn for all College assemblies and functions both in and outside of Catholic College. They are to be worn whenever students are representing the College at school and community events.

6. Sports Uniform/VET Clothing Requirements

Students are to arrive at school in full, regular uniform at the beginning of the day. Students are to change for other approved, relevant classes. Any alternative to this situation may only take place, if agreed upon, after consultation with the Campus Director.

7. Dealing with Uniform Infringements

The College has established a process for dealing with uniform infringements and a set of consequences of repeating non-conformity. The Assistant Principal Learning and Teaching together with the Wellbeing Development Team, determine the process and the consequences.

In cases of extreme breaches of the uniform and personal presentation regulations, parents will be notified. The student will be removed from class and the parent may be asked to collect or make arrangements for the student to go home.

Students who are not wearing the uniform correctly or who are wearing items not in accord with the approved accessories will be informed and will have their names recorded. The non-approved accessories will be confiscated.
