In trouble at 4/19, the Ashgrove innings was resurrected by O'Neill (69) & Walker (34) who put on 79, and enabled the Queenslanders to post 165. Fennamore continued to push his claim for Bowler of the Carnival with 4/28. Chasing on such a hot day was always going to be tough, and at 7/95 the match looked beyond reach for Woodlawn, despite Harris' stoic 52. Late hitting from A.Battese (34), Bezrouchko (16) & Fennamore (14) brought St Johns within reach, before two late wickets ended any hopes of a comeback victory.
