Dear College Community

Recently, the College enjoyed a visit from some very special guests; Sister Mary Babic, Superior General of Our Lady of Sion (based in Rome) Sister Marie-Lise Adou, Member of the Our Lady of Sion Leadership Team (Rome), Sister Patricia Fox and Sister Mary Babic (Sisters of Our Lady of Sion based in Melbourne) visited Catholic College Sale. They met with students and staff in both formal and informal surroundings with a tour of both campuses.

Sister Patricia, who has recently arrived back in Australia after 30 years working as a missionary in the poorer communities of the Philippines, gave a presentation of her work to staff and senior students, as a missionary Sister and the challenges facing the Filipino people, especially the poor. Land ownership and social justice were key themes in her presentation. Sister Patricia then gave a more detailed presentation to members of the Sale community in the evening.

## TERM 3 HOLIDAY VCE PRACTICE EXAMS - SAVE THE DATE -

Practice examinations for Year 12 students and Year 11 students completing a Unit 3/4 sequence will take place during the Term 3 school holidays between **September 30th and October 3rd**. These exams provide valuable learning and preparatory experience for students, are taken under examination conditions and give the students valuable practice at exam technique. In addition, these practice exams will enable students to focus on any areas that need improvement for the extremely short amount of time available in Term 4.

We are unable to make these examinations compulsory for students given that they are during school holidays, however they will prove to be a worthwhile experience and students should make every effort to be present and assist the College in its endeavour to provide the best possible preparation prior to the examinations in October/November.

Semester Two is underway at Catholic College Sale. For Year 12's there remains just one more term of learning. On Wednesday 17th July all students undertaking a Unit 3/4 subject will have the opportunity to book a parent student teacher interview with their teacher. Meetings will take place in the John 23rd Building and bookings will be able to be made through the Parent Access Module.

## Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD)



Every year, all schools in Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to identify information already available in the school about supports provided to students with disability. These relate to legislative requirements under the Disability Discrimination Act 1992 and the Disability Standards for Education 2005, in line with the NCCD guidelines (2019).

The NCCD provides state and federal governments with the information they need to plan more broadly for the support of students with disability.

The school will provide data to the Australian Government in such a way that no individual student will be able to be identified – the privacy and confidentiality of all students is ensured. All information is protected by privacy laws that regulate the collection, storage and disclosure of personal information.
